

Exercise 1: Risk Management

Imagine you are the Country Manager of Palestine and you are preparing your Security Plan. Using the Possible Threat List that we have given you, please **choose one of the threats** that you think you can find in Palestine and complete the table below using what we have seen during the webinar to fill in all the data:

- **Threat:** potential threat in the country
- **Place:** The places or regions of the country affected by this threat
- **Actors:** Actors that can be affected by this threat (ex: staff, local population, partners, etc.)
- **Indicator:** Indicator that we are going to use to measure this threat (ex: number of car accidents reported to the local police, number of cases of malaria, etc.)
- **Vulnerability:** Level of exposure to that threat (ex: in case of car accident we will be vulnerable if we do a lot of displacements or move a lot by road, we will not be vulnerable to landmines if we do not work in the mined region of a specific country, etc.)
- **Risk:** we must include the all the possibilities and consequences of this threat happening (worst case scenario and best case scenario). For example, in case of car accident the worst-case scenario will be the death of someone because of the accident, but it could also mean something less severe as small damage on the vehicle, etc.
- **Impact:** Always include here the impact of the worst-case scenario. We will use the following criteria: Critical (5), Severe (4), Moderate (3), Minor (2), Negligible (1)
- **Probability:** probability of this threat happening (for example, if we work in a region where an illness proliferation is very high, the probability of the threat of getting sick with that illness maybe very probable)
- **Preventive measures:** measures taken in order to avoid the probability and risk of that threat happening (for example: use mosquito repellent or mosquito nets for avoiding malaria, etc.)
- **Reactive measures:** Measures that we should have in case of this threat becoming a reality (ex: contact a doctor, contact the police, evacuation, etc.).

Exercise 2: Incident report
